The **University of New Hampshire (UNH)**, the state's flagship public university, is nationally recognized for leadership in cybersecurity education and workforce development. Central to UNH's offerings is the fully online M.S. in Cybersecurity Policy and Risk Management (CPRM), designed for mid-career and management-level professionals. Unlike programs rooted solely in computing or engineering, CPRM integrates policy, risk management, and leadership with technical awareness, preparing graduates to manage the full spectrum of cyber challenges. Guided by expert faculty and industry professionals, students learn to embed cybersecurity into enterprise risk management through applied assignments that translate directly to the workplace.

UNH also offers a B.S. in Homeland Security, a B.S. in Computer Science with a cybersecurity concentration,

and an M.S. in Cybersecurity Engineering, preparing graduates to secure networks, systems, and critical infrastructure. These programs are strengthened by the Center for Cybersecurity Leadership, Education, and Outreach (CCLEO), which showcases faculty and student research, fosters collaboration across disciplines, and provides resources to businesses and government agencies locally and beyond.

Through hands-on learning, interdisciplinary integration, and strong public and private sector engagement, UNH graduates are well prepared for careers in intelligence, law enforcement, counter-terrorism, risk management, and cybersecurity leadership. As the first institution in New Hampshire designated a National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense, UNH advances the nation's cyber resilience while empowering organizations to manage emerging risks.
